

Parental Involvement

Aim: To promote partnership with parents/guardians, with the view of enabling and enhancing better educational achievement in their children

Objectives:

1. To promote positive engagement between the home and school.
2. Integrate new migrant families into the school & community, especially enhancing their literacy skills, providing appropriate courses.
3. To promote Parental Wellbeing and a positive disposition towards school.
4. To improve and involve parents in literacy and numeracy initiatives, thus supporting parents in their role as primary educators of their children.
5. Contribute to ensuring a whole-school approach to improving attendance, punctuality, participation and retention, with SCP and in partnership with relevant community agencies.
6. To familiarise and engage parents/guardians in their child/children's education process, particular focus put on those with language barriers and those new to the Irish educational system.

7. Improve communication between the school and the parent body, including a broader range of mediums. This will include the creation of resources in a variety of languages to target parents with little or no English.
8. To increase the number of parents involved in school activities / courses year on year by 3%
9. Create Baseline data on the number of parents attending Parent Teacher meetings and improve by a suitable percentage over 3 years
